

Baie d'Urfé - Senneville Squadron

The Baie d'Urfé - Senneville Squadron is based on the Canadian Yachting Association's seven level "Learn to Sail" program. The C.Y.A. standards provide safe, standardized instruction for recreation and competition in sailing dinghies. Students are instructed in sailing theory, sailing technique and care and maintenance of the boats. Priority is given to on-water practice of these skills. The students will be tested on the C.Y.A. "learn to sail" standards starting with white sail I through to Bronze level V. Once the fundamentals have been mastered, the more advanced students will be introduced to small boat racing.

OPTI LEARN-TO-SAIL PROGRAM

An Opti learn-to-sail program is offered to our young sailors aged 8 to 12 years old. This program covers basic to intermediate level skills required to sail an Optimist dinghy safely, in wind strengths of 8-16 km/hr. Applicable White Sail Level I, II and/or III certification may be awarded upon consistent demonstration of the skills outlined by the CYA. The children must also pass a swimming test.

Schedule: Four, two-week morning sessions from 8:30 am to 12:30 pm

- Session 1 A – Monday, June 25th to Friday, July 6th
- Session 2 A – Monday, July 9th to Friday July 20nd
- Session 3 A – Monday, July 23th to Friday, August 3th
- Session 4 A – Monday, August 6th to Friday, August 17th

Schedule: Four, two-week afternoon sessions from 1 pm to 5 pm

- Session 1 – Monday, June 25th to Friday, July 6th
- Session 2 – Monday, July 9th to Friday July 20th
- Session 3 – Monday, July 23rd to Friday, August 3rd
- Session 4 – Monday, August 6th to Friday, August 17th

Cost per session: (\$50 discount is granted should you provide your own boat)

- \$275 – Residents of Baie d'Urfé or Senneville and BDYC members
- \$300 – Non Residents

JUNIOR PROGRAM *(a 10% discount will be offered for the third child)*

The Junior Squadron course is open to juniors who are at least 10 years old for White Sail I, II and III and not over 17 years old as of June 1st, 2012. The children must also pass a swimming test. Space in the program is limited to ensure the safety of the children and the quality of the instruction.

White Sail I, II and III

These are the introductory levels. Beginners are introduced to and taught the basic skills of sailing. These levels cover safety, seamanship and boat handling in winds to 15km/hr velocity.

This course is 1:00 pm to 5:00 pm, Monday to Thursday and 9:30 am to 5:00 pm on Friday, for the duration of 2 weeks. Students will sail our fleet of CL 14s and squadron 13s. Each student must be able to swim 50 yards while wearing a shirt, long trousers, and running shoes and provide their own approved life jacket.

Schedule: Four, two-week sessions

- Session 1 – Monday, June 25th to Friday, July 6th
- Session 2 – Monday, July 9th to Friday July 20nd
- Session 3 – Monday, July 23th to Friday, August 3rd
- Session 4 – Monday, August 6th to Friday, August 17th

Cost per session: (\$50 discount is granted should you provide your own boat)

- \$300 – Residents of Baie d’Urfé or Senneville and BDYC members
- \$325 – Non Residents

Bronze Sail IV and V

These are levels where sailors are introduced to advanced sailing techniques, including sail trim, boat tuning, boat maintenance, the trapeze and use of the spinnaker. After completing bronze standards, sailors are competent in winds up to 25km/hr. This course is 1:00 pm to 5:00 pm, Monday, Wednesday and Thursday and 9:30 am to 5:00 pm, Tuesday and Friday, for the duration of 4 weeks. Students will sail our fleet of Laser IIs, Club 420s and Byte. Each student must be able to swim 50 yards while wearing a shirt, long trousers, running shoes and an approved life jacket.

Depending on registration and interest the students will be offered the opportunity to participate in several regattas throughout the season. The cost of regatta participation, including boat and sailor transportation, food, accommodation and entry fees, is not included in the Bronze registration fee. Please note that parent’s participation in regatta events is essential.

Schedule: Two, four-week sessions.

- Session 1 – Monday, June 25th to Friday, July 20th
- Session 2 – Monday, July 23rd to Friday, August 17th

Cost per session: (\$100 discount is granted should you provide your own boat)

- \$575 – Residents of Baie d’Urfé or Senneville and BDYC members
- \$625 – Non Residents

RACE TEAM

This program is designed to allow young sailors aged 10 to 18 to learn the basics of small sailboat racing and to develop their racing skills so as to allow them to participate in a various regattas. Prior sailing experience and a keen interest in sailboat racing is essential. Applicants should have completed their White Sail II level at a minimum. The program will be designed around a Regatta schedule which will be determined by the coach and the applicants. The costs of the program are based on the costs of coaching only. Additional costs such as regatta entry fees, transportation, out of town accommodation and supervision are be borne by the participants. Logistical support is also provided for single and double handed teams. It is understood that the race team will attend several regattas over the course of the summer some of which will require travel outside the local area.

Schedule: June 28th – August 18th.

Thursday evenings: 6 - 9 pm &
Saturday mornings: 10 am – 12 pm.

Cost for the 8 week session: (\$50 discount is granted should you provide your own boat) \$225

PRE AND POST SEASON

This program is open to all sailors. Applicants should have completed their White Sail II level at a minimum.

Schedule: Two sessions

- Pre Season : Sundays May 27, June 3, 10 & 17 – 10:00 am to 2:00 pm
- Post Season: Saturdays Sept 8, 15, 22, 29 – 10:00 am to 2:00 pm

Cost per session: (\$50 discount is granted should you provide your own boat)

- \$150 – Residents of Baie d’Urfé or Senneville and BDYC members
- \$175 – Non Residents

ADULT PROGRAM

These 15 hour courses will cover the knowledge and skills required to sail a double-handed dinghy safely, without supervision. The instructors will respond to the varying skill levels of participants on either CL14s or Squadron 13s. CYA White Sail Level I to III can be achieved. Advanced sailors will train on double-handed Club 420 dinghies with three sails. These participants are taught advanced boat handling skills, which include the use of the trapeze and the spinnaker sail, and learn about sail trim and boat tuning. Bronze sail IV and/or V certification may be awarded upon consistent demonstration of the skills outlined by the the CYA.

Schedule: Three sessions of 15 hours each

- Session 1 – Mondays: 6 pm to 9 pm - Jul 2,9,16,23 & 30
- Session 2 – Tuesdays: 6 pm to 9 pm - Jul 3,10,17,24 & 31
- Session 3 – Saturdays: 1 pm to 4 pm - Jul 7,14,21,28 & Aug 4

Cost: \$275 (plus taxes, total \$316.18)
